Children's social and emotional well-being is supported through interventions and 1-1 support. (Measured through data tracking and observational reports)

IMPACT

- The Headteacher is responsible for the overall support of the following vulnerable groups: Pupil Premium, English as an additional language, 2YO, rising 3s, Children in Care & adopted children, and monitors their progress regularly.
- Children in receipt of EYPP are supported by the SENTA. Each child has their progress monitored termly to set targets in collaboration with the child's key person. All staff are aware of the PP children and endeavour to involve them in sustained shared thinking experiences whenever possible.
- The majority of children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding were working at age appropriate levels in all areas of learning at the end of the academic year 2022-23. This meant that they were ready for their transition to school.
